### **ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY/BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH:**

The Alberta Government asked the Clean Air Strategic Alliance (CASA) to lead the development of a new approach to managing air emissions from Alberta's energy sector. There had to be a balance between protecting the environment and public health, with the growing economy and cost of energy.

Martha Kostuch was Co-Chair of the multi-stakeholder CASA Electricity Project Team (EPT) that was formed in 2001. Kostuch also sat on all the sub-groups of the EPT including, the Public Consultation sub group (2002-2003), which was formed with the objective of keeping the public informed of their progress, to hear from the public about their concerns with electricity and to interact with groups and public via the internet or meetings; the Renewable and Alternative Energy Project Team (2003-2007), which was formed with the objective to explore and recommend renewable and alternative sources of electricity, to establish targets and mechanisms to achieve those targets, and reviews of existing barriers to renewable and alternative energy; the Management Options sub-group (2001-2003), which worked to develop standards and performance expectations for air emissions from electrical generating power plants; and the Implementation Advisory Group (2004-2006), which was formed to create an action plan to implement the EPT framework. These sub-groups reported back to EPT and any final recommendations made by the sub-groups were compiled by the EPT to be forwarded to CASA.

### **CUSTODIAL HISTORY:**

In April 2008, Martha Kostuch signed an agreement with Athabasca University to have her records digitized but she passed away before this work could be started. After her death on April 23, 2008, her records went into the custody of her son Edward and in July 2008, he donated the records to Athabasca University.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT:**

The series consists of material pertaining to work done by Martha Kostuch on the CASA Electricity Project Team and sub-groups.

Textual records include; agendas, meeting minutes and attachments, correspondence, reports, newspaper clippings and workshop proceedings. As well, much of the material has been annotated by Martha Kostuch.
